

# NOT AN ISOLATED CASE

## death by racist state violence

the death of Achidi John

On 9 December 2001, police officers and a doctor from the Institute of Forensic Medicine at the Hamburg University Hospital committed the fatal so-called „use of emetics“ on Achidi John from Nigeria. Five police officers fixed Achidi John on the floor in a room of the institute while the forensic doctor tried to insert a tube into Achidi John's stomach several times until she finally succeeded and was able to pump emetics and water into his stomach.

On 8 August 2022, the police were called by concerned carers at a facility for unaccompanied refugee minors in Dortmund. The 16-year-old Mouhamed Lamine Dramé from Senegal, who suffered from psychological problems after a traumatic escape, was sitting in the courtyard of the facility and had a knife with him. The counsellors feared that the young man might harm himself. Twelve police officers appeared, tear-gassed and tasered Mouhamed, and finally shot him with six bullets from a machine gun, four of which hit his body. He died a short time later in hospital.

The Mouhamed Solidarity Circle is fighting for the circumstances of Mouhamed Lamine Dramé's death to be clarified and for the German state to draw consequences from the inconceivable events. However, them - and we - are not only concerned about the death of the young man, but also about the many other people who became victims of racist state violence. The Solidarity Circle has therefore named its demonstration on 19 November 2022 „There are 1000 Mouhameds - They deserve justice“.
